### **The External Evaluator will:**

- follow the communication among partners and the project activities from commencement to conclusion;
- liaise with the transnational coordinator on a regular basis;
- evaluate the management of the project and coordination of the partnership;
- effectiveness of the partnership working and the relevance of the outcomes and products to the needs of the beneficiaries and the aims of the project;
- evaluate the activities of the project, the methodologies and processes adopted by the partnership in carrying out the IOs;
- comment on the quality and relevance of the final products – The training course (2) and resources;
- identify weaknesses including potential risks or non-compliance with the ERASMUS+ regulations and alert the partnership in a timely fashion;
- Produce an interim report on the project activities (particularly the Intellectual Outputs of the project) and the outcomes; and, a final report on his/her assessment of the delivery of the ERASMUS+ project with recommendations, if any.
